I use MOVAVI for both of these and they are linked so that once you capture the screen video this can then be opened in the MOVAVI Editor.

I use these all the time and have some very good features, and easy to use.

I have the Lifetime version of both, but they are also available as a Subscription as well.

They can be purchased as a bundle as well for a very good price.

The best YouTube (and many other websites) Downloader, that I use all the time, is part of a pack of programs known as: HD Video Converter Factory by:

WonderFox Soft. I have used other YouTube downloaders in the past, but this is the best and most amazing for what it can do.

This software includes: Video Converter, Video Downloader, Video Recorder, GIF Maker, Toolbox including: Photo to Video Maker, Ringtone Studio, Split screen Video Maker and a Subtitle Extractor.

Storing and distributing your video

Once you have made your video, and you intend either keeping it to yourself, or allowing selected people to view it, or allow the public to view it, then It is a good idea to store it on YouTube.

To do this you need a free Google account, login to this account and then goto

YouTube, choose " + Create" in the top right of the screen and then choose

"Upload Videos" then follow the bouncing ball.

When saving it you can choose:

- Private (email listed people only can see it.
- Unlisted: access only from a link supplied to a person or group, and
- Public: Everyone can search/find it and view it.
